## A Brief Look Back With A View To The Future

The year just completed was a wonderful one for The Energy Co-op. And as we enter 2020, each of us on your cooperative's staff remains committed to helping you, its members, continue to affordably and sustainably buy, use, and understand energy. But having closed the books on last year, the start of the new one gives us an opportunity to briefly take stock of where we are and where we are headed.

In 2019, The Energy Co-op's goals were straightforward ones. We wanted to engage our members more often and in more meaningful ways. Plus, we sought to grow our cooperative by expanding our existing programs and adding new ones. Finally, we had as a goal to improve The Energy Co-op's current and future financial well-being.

So, how did we do?

In addition to our monthly newsletters and blog posts, early in 2019 we held lunch and dinner discussions with several dozen members who accepted our invitation. As a result of those conversations, we convened a member volunteer committee, which led to several speaking engagements and many other great suggestions, including one that resulted in The Energy Co-op renewing its ties with our founder, Weavers Way. Our annual meeting at the Friends Center in June was well-attended by members and other partners. And many more in our community joined us at WHYY in November to celebrate The Energy Co-op's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

In 2020, we're planning even more member engagement. Meryl Sands, an experienced, thoughtful, and dynamic renewable energy professional, joined our staff last month to work with our member volunteers and to fire up The Energy Co-op's most effective competitive advantage—members like you! See below for more about Meryl and our invitation to all members to meet with us.

We also worked in 2019 to expand current programs and to initiate new ones. In October, we launched our renewable natural gas (RNG) program in PGW's service territory. As a

result, those in Philadelphia who heat their homes with natural gas can now do so with more environmentally friendly landfill methane. In addition, we entered into a cooperation agreement with Energy Coordinating Agency (ECA) to offer our members energy efficiency audits and to support ECA's work in training at-risk populations to participate in the green economy. Also, because many members depend on The Energy Co-op's vendor network for reliably affordable home heating oil, we filled fill in gaps in our service territory.

That member outreach and those program efforts resulted in a modest increase in Energy Co-op membership. More importantly, our goal was not just to add new members, but also to become more for our loyal members by doing more for them and for our community. 2019 was just a start. We are committed to doing better in 2020.

A large part of doing better will come through more member engagement. In February, we plan to organize the initial meeting of our first Energy Co-op member neighborhood volunteer group in Mount Airy/Germantown. We are also working on several strategic partnerships with mission-driven organizations like ours to both advance their and our shared goals as well as offer Energy Co-op members more opportunity to learn more about energy issues of interest to them. We expect to announce those affiliations later this winter.

Finally, although definitive numbers are not yet available, early indications are that 2019 financial results, once finalized, will be positive and that The Energy Co-op's financial position will have improved during the year.

In closing, on behalf of your Energy Co-op staff and in the hope of having the opportunity to meet each of you in the coming year, we wish you all a healthy and happy New Year!
