Just this week we caught wind of the East Goshen Sustainability Advisory Committee's involvement in shaping the <u>West Chester Area Clean Energy</u> <u>Future</u> Campaign, which recently held its kickoff meeting as they pursue efforts to engage their communities on energy reduction, electrification, and transition to renewable energy. Our staff accountant, Bryan Hutchinson, is a member of the East Goshen Sustainability Advisory Committee. More on all that in our forthcoming blog piece! Milton Meyer, another Energy Co-op member, continues his involvement with the Swarthmore EAC, as they work to forward sustainable energy initiatives in Swarthmore. Their EAC has partnered with several other area organizations to help advise their Borough Council and educate citizens on matters that affect the quality of the environment in the Borough. Recently, their recommendation to add solar panels to the Borough Hall was accepted, and they have been lobbying the Borough to make their next electricity contract renewable and to procure EV police vehicles.
