Learn about Environmental, Social, & Governance Investing – December 7

Over the past decade, investors have paid increased attention to the environmental, social, and governance aspects of companies' operations in order to guide their investment decisions. Known as ESG investing, or sustainable investing, these strategies have had a profound impact on the financial sector with no signs of slowing. As of September 2021, assets in U.S. sustainable funds totaled more than \$330 billion.

So, we decided to make ESG investing the focus of our fourth Member-to-Member webinar, coming up on December 7, 2021. We'll welcome a distinguished pair of Energy Co-op members to discuss their experience and answer audience questions. No investment advice provided, but join us for a spirited and engaging conversation on how more and more investors are making investment choices that align with their socially conscious values.

Presenters include Energy Co-op member and Board member Ethan Birchard, Director of Marketing and Business Development for Prentiss Smith & Company, and Energy Co-op member Margaret Thompson, who has been a hobby ESG investor since the 1990's.

Looking Back at 2021 Member Events

2021 has been a year of adaptation and innovation. At The Energy Co-op, we started the year presenting all member events virtually. Beginning this summer, we've been fortunate to hold some events in-person, while maintaining the remote model for our educational offerings.

We launched two brand new event series in 2021. Our Member-to-Member webinars provide an outlet for individuals in our community to share their expertise on topics including the <u>Green New Deal</u>, <u>electric vehicles</u>, <u>sustainable</u> <u>home design</u>, and <u>ESG investing</u>. The quarterly New Member Orientations acquaint those who recently joined our cooperative community with all that Energy Co-op membership has to offer.

Other virtual events included Member Ambassador Training series and six unique events during <u>Earth Month</u> to connect members and educate about renewable energy. For a second consecutive year, we also convened our <u>Annual</u> <u>Member Meeting</u> remotely, and just last month hosted a <u>Member Town Hall</u>.

There were several instances, however, when our staff was able to attend or present at events out in the community, including Ronald Fisher being <u>invited</u> by the West Pikeland EAC to speak about renewable energy, and staff spreading the word about our programs at the <u>ecoWURD Environmental</u> Justice Summit, <u>Haverford Township Day</u>, and <u>Philly Grocery Co-op Day</u>.
